Author of hundreds of essays on historical and descriptive linguistics (on Old Persian, Elamite, Parthian, Middle Persian, Sogdian, Kurdish, Balochi, New Persian, Urdu and Indo-European languages), socio- and ethnolinguistics, lexicography, didactics of the languages of the Middle East and South Asia, political history of East Asia and the Indian subcontinent, history of Oriental studies in Italy and Europe, and so on.
